- The vacancies of General stream are most suitable for the people with a passion for financial markets, a keen sense of learning and staying competitive amid changing or uncertain conditions and looking to make a career with the capital markets' regulator of the country, SEBI.

- SEBI Grade A officers are recruited as Assistant Managers. They are posted to different departments / offices of SEBI and assigned work on areas ranging from policy formulation to inspection, supervision, intermediary registration, investigation, adjudication, etc. The various departments at SEBI, to name a few, include:

 - Department of Debt and Hybrid Securities
 - AIF and FPI Department
 - Department Economic and Policy Analysis
 - Market Regulation Department
 - Market Intermediaries Regulation and Supervision Department

Eligibility (as per 2024 notification)

For the general Stream, the eligibility includes:

- Age** – maximum 30 years as on cut-off date (relaxation of 5 years for SC/ST, 3 years for OBC-non creamy layer, 10 years for PwBD and 5 years for ex-servicemen candidates).
- Education (General Stream)** –
 - Master’s Degree/Post Graduate Diploma (minimum two year’s duration) in any discipline, or
 - Bachelors’ Degree in Law, or
 - Bachelors’ Degree in Engineering from a recognized university, or
 - CA / CFA / CS / CWA

Note – Bachelors in commerce or any other discipline apart from law or engineering, will not be eligible.
- Education marks criteria** – No minimum marks requirement for the eligible degrees mentioned above.
- Work experience** – not required.

SEBI, the Capital markets regulator

SEBI is the Indian capital markets regulator, which was established on April 12, 1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992. As a market regulator, SEBI's major functions include:

- Development and regulation of securities market
- Ensuring that markets are fair, efficient and transparent.
- Protecting interest of investors in securities

It is one of the strongest regulator in the country covering regulation and development of:

- capital markets.
- corporate debt markets
- commodity markets
- derivatives market

SEBI regulates more than 35,000 entities and intermediaries across the following types:

- Stock exchanges like NSE and BSE
- Commodity exchanges like MCX, NCDEX
- Depositories (like NSDL and CDSL), Depository Participants (DP) and designated depository participants (DDP)
- Clearing Corporations
- Mutual Funds
- Collective Investment Schemes (CIS)
- Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs)
- Infrastructure investment Trusts (InvITs)
- Real estate Investment Trusts (REITs)
- Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs)
- Credit Rating Agencies (CRAs)
- Market intermediaries like stock-brokers, investment managers, merchant bankers, registrars and transfer agents, research analysts, underwriters, vault managers, etc.

SEBI GRADE A – EXAM PATTERN, SYLLABUS AND CUT-OFF

SEBI Grade A exam is held in 3 phases:

- **Phase 1** – written exam (objective) consisting of 2 papers. This is a qualifying phase with a general cut-off criterion.
- **Phase 2** – written exam consisting of 2 papers, 1 objective and another descriptive. In this phase, merit-based cut-off is taken for progress to Phase 3. This Phase has 85% weightage in final selection.
- **Phase 3** – interview carrying 15% weightage for final selection.

Phase 3 - Interview

- Based on merit cut-off for Phase 2 exam, usually, candidates equaling 3 times the number of vacancies are shortlisted and called for the Interview stage.
- The interview is conducted by SEBI for each shortlisted candidate with an experienced panel.
- Candidate may opt for interview either in Hindi or English.
- The interview carries 15% weightage.

Final Selection

Final Selection will be through merit list which will be prepared by adding marks secured by candidates in Phase II examination (85% weightage) and interview (15% weightage).

- ✓ In **Phase I Paper 1** there are 4 subjects – Quant, Reasoning, English and GA. You can leave 1 subject entirely. Study two subjects thoroughly and the third one partially. Devote 2-3 hours for Paper 1 on a daily basis for initial 15 days.
- ✓ Since there is no sectional cut-off in Paper 1 topics, first attempt questions from your comfort zone topic.
- ✓ For **Phase I Paper 2**, follow the study plan. You can choose to leave some topics.
- ✓ Daily revise previous day's work

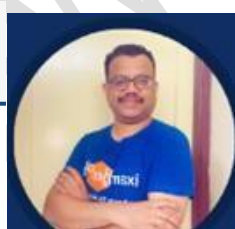
