- Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) recruits at Grade A (Assistant Manager level).
- The vacancies of Legal stream are most suitable for the people with a passion for securities and financial markets, a keen sense of learning and staying competitive amid changing or uncertain conditions and looking to make a career with the capital markets' regulator of the country, SEBI in the legal discipline.

#### Job Profile

- SEBI Grade A Legal Officers are recruited as Assistant Managers. They are posted to different departments / offices of SEBI and assigned work on areas ranging from policy formulation to inspection, supervision, enforcement, investigation, adjudication, etc. The various departments at SEBI where a Legal Officer is posted, to name a few, include:
  - Enforcement Department
  - Legal Affairs Department
  - Enquiries and Adjudication Department

#### Salary and perks

The gross salary of a SEBI Grade A officer is approximately Rs.1.49 lakh per month. Including various other benefits that are provided to a SEBI Grade A officer, the total salary and perks amount to approximately Rs. 2 lakh per month.

#### Eligibility (as per 2024 notification)

For the Legal Stream, the eligibility includes:

- **Age** maximum 30 years as on cut-off date (relaxation of 5 years for SC/ST, 3 years for OBC-non creamy layer, 10 years for PwBD and 5 years for ex-servicemen candidates).
- Mandatory Qualification: Education (Legal Stream) -
  - Bachelors' Degree in Law from a recognized university/institute,
- Education marks criteria No minimum marks requirement for the eligible degrees mentioned above.
- **Desirable experience** Two years post qualification experience as an advocate (including as an associate in an Advocate's or Solicitor's Office or Law Firm) after being enrolled is a desirable qualification
  - Work experience is not mandatory. Fresher's can also apply.

#### SEBI, the Capital markets regulator

SEBI is the Indian capital markets regulator, which was established on April 12, 1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992. As a market regulator, SEBI's major functions include:

- Development and regulation of securities market
- Ensuring that markets are fair, efficient and transparent.
- Protecting interest of investors in securities

It is one of the strongest regulator in the country covering regulation and development of:

- · capital markets.
- corporate debt markets
- · commodity markets
- derivatives market

SEBI regulates more than 35,000 entities and intermediaries across the following types:

- Stock exchanges like NSE and BSE
- Commodity exchanges like MCX, NCDEX
- Depositories (like NSDL and CDSL), Depositary Participants (DP) and designated depository participants (DDP)
- Clearing Corporations
- Mutual Funds
- Collective Investment Schemes (CIS)
- Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs)
- Infrastructure investment Trusts (InvITs)
- Real estate Investment Trusts (REITs)
- Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs)
- Credit Rating Agencies (CRAs)
- Market intermediaries like stock-brokers, investment managers, merchant bankers, registrars and transfer agents, research analysts, underwriters, vault managers, etc.

**Headquartered in Mumbai**, SEBI is considered one of the strongest regulators in the world having enormous powers of market regulation and supervision. **Its powers** can be summarised as:

 conducts investigation and enforcement action in executive capacity

 passes rulings and orders in its judicial capacity



**Nikhil was working as an advocate** and preparing for judiciary exams when he came across SEBI Legal exam. For Legal, he referred to Bare Acts. He referred to newspaper for Descriptive English and current affairs module. He practised by attempting Section Tests and Mock Tests from ixamBee's course.

**Nikhil** says "Don't get swayed by syllabus, be consistent."



Suman was a judiciary aspirant and when she came to know about SEBI Legal exam, she read about Securities market to familiarize herself. She focused on newspaper reading for English, BeePedia for GA and choose to do selective study for Quant. She focused on ixamBee notes for Law and test series provided in the course for practice. #### SEBI GRADE A LEGAL - EXAM PATTERN, SYLLABUS AND CUT-OFF

SEBI Grade A Legal exam is held in 3 phases:

- **Phase 1** Online written exam (objective) consisting of 2 papers. This is a qualifying phase with a general cut-off criterion.
- **Phase 2** Online written exam consisting of 2 papers. In this phase, merit-based cut-off is taken for progress to Phase 3. This Phase has 85% weightage in final selection.
- Phase 3 interview carrying 15% weightage for final selection.

#### Phase 3 - Interview

- Based on merit cut-off for Phase 2 exam, usually, candidates equaling 3 times the number of vacancies are shortlisted and called for the Interview stage.
- The interview is conducted by SEBI for each shortlisted candidate with an experienced panel.
- Candidate may opt for interview either in Hindi or English.



- The interview carries 15% weightage.
- Due weightage up to a maximum of 3.75 marks(25% of 15) will be given to candidates with relevant post qualification experience
- Candidates who want to take the benefit of post qualification experience, should have the
  relevant experience as on the last date of filling online application. They have to fill the
  experience details in online application form. They should produce the relevant experience
  certificate before interview.

- ✓ For **Phase I Paper 2**, follow the study plan. You can choose to leave some topics.
